Archer Community Christmas Gathering

Thursday December 12th, 6pm will be The Annual Christmas Gathering at the Archer Community Center. This has been an annual event for many years dating back to the late 1950's. It had several locations throughout the City. It had been sponsored by the Women's and Garden Clubs. Once the Archer Historical Society became the sponsor the event was moved to the railroad depot. After Archer acquired a community center it moved there and continues to be the setting for the event. It was originated as a kick off to the Christmas season and a time for friends and families to gather to wish each other a joyous season. The program for this years event consists of greetings from the mayor, music from various individuals and groups. Santa arrives and delivers toys to the children assisted by the Elves and Santa Clause. Toys and gifts are donated by the toys for tots program and other individuals. Various kinds of cookies donated by the community and hot cider and hot chocolate donated by Maddox and the Hope families. This years event is co-hosted by the City of Archer and the Archer Historical Society.

The Meaning of Preservation

Preservation is a noun

that means the act, or process of keeping something valued, alive, intact, or free from damage or decay. It is also the act of keeping something in its original

state or in good condition. Restoration on the other hand is noun that means the act or process of returning something to its original condition by bringing back something that existed before. Many people confuse these two

processes including those who are very good at both. One method of preservation for ferrous or iron items is the use of electrolysis. Materials such as brass, copper, silver or gold are cleaned and preserved through other methods. This method for iron is used by museums and amateurs alike. It is a great method to prevent further damage through decay. Rust is the number one villain to any artifact that is composed of ferrous material. Florida soil is notorious for this problem. Agriculture and the use of fertilizers and other chemicals compound the damaged object. And once, contact with the air, the decay will rapidly accelerate further destroying the artifact. To prevent this rust needs to be removed

by non destructive method. The use of acid, lemon juice, even olive oil is a destructive method. They will remove rust but over a period of time even the artifact its self. These

solutions penetrate into the iron.
Unfortunately use of these solutions is a quick fix. Electrolysis latches on to the rust only. Electrolysis takes more time, sometimes up to 12 hour with several cleaning episodes between times. Museums

will some times use X-ray to determine if electrolysis is used. May use other methods in their arsenal. After electrolysis the object must be further protected, by sealing it from contact with the air. Sealing prevents any air and moisture penetrating the metal. Thus it is protected for ever more. With hot wax method this hoe is forever preserved. You may may see the results displayed in the Historic Archer Depot under Farm Equipment. It was found in Archer and it dates from the 1860'. Donated to the Museum by Bill Zettler one of our own dear members. Preservation:
